ORDINANCE NO. 79-670
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPERSEDING ORDINANCE NO. 534, 611, AND 77-651, CONCERNING WATER AND SEWER SERVICE TO THE VILLAGE OF SUNBURY, OHIO, ITS INHABITANTS AND OTHER USERS, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and advisable to establish a water service charge for water service and sewer service to be rendered to the Village of Sunbury, Ohio, and to its inhabitants and other users which will provide sufficient revenue to meet the operating and maintenance expenses of its waterworks system, and to provide for the payment of and extending and improving said waterworks system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Sunbury, Delaware County, Ohio, members elected thereto concurring:

SECTION 1. That Ordinances Nos. 534, 611, and 77-651 are hereby amended and superseded by this Ordinance.

SECTION 2. That commencing April 1, 1979, the quarterly charges for the water service rate shall be increased by fifteen per cent (15%).

SECTION 3. That commencing April 1, 1979, the quarterly charges for the water service rate shall be one hundred ten (110%) per cent of the water service rate.

SECTION 4. That commencing April 1, 1979, the following shall be the rates charged for the supply of water services and for the sewer service and tap fees:

The foregoing charges are minimum rates and maximum rates and the Village reserves the right and is obligated to increase the same at any time should the revenues of the waterworks system prove insufficient to pay the operating and maintenance expenses and extending and improving said waterworks system.

SECTION 5. That commencing April 1, 1979, the charge for bulk water being sold to bulk water haulers shall increase from \$1.00 per thousand gallon to \$2.00 per thousand gallon.

SECTION 6. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 7. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances previously adopted by the Village of Sunbury, Ohio, concerning water and sewer service and procedures for the Village of Sunbury, Ohio, not specifically amended herein, are to remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 8. It is found and ordered that the actions of the Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of the Council and any of its committees shall result in an open formal action, there are in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

This ordinance and its clause is declared to be an emergency measure in that the public peace, health, safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the Village require the emergency of revised rates to support the finance of the cost thereof, and the immediate effectiveness of which ordinance is necessary, and it shall take effect and be in force upon its passage and approval by the Mayor.
