Stirring Up Some Easy Recipes

Summer is busy for everyone and often there isn't much time left for the usual things in the kitchen. One of the following quick and easy recipes may be just what you need when you are out of or need something simple other than a package or a mix.

For a spur-of-the-moment cookout, a picnic or just to refuel the cookie jar you'll love this brownie recipe from my daughter, Rene DeMint's files. You'll find it just as easy as a mix from the store and it tastes a whole lot better. It's a Better Homes & Garden recipe and always brings compliments.

Fudge Brownies
 1/2 c. butter or margarine
 1 c. granulated sugar
 1 tsp. vanilla
 2 eggs
 2 (1 oz.) squares unsweetened chocolate, melted & cooled
 3/4 c. sifted all-purpose flour
 1/2 c. flour
 In medium saucepan, melt butter and chocolate.

Remove from heat; stir in sugar. Blend in eggs, one at a time. Add vanilla. Stir in flour and chocolate until well mixed.

Spread in greased 9x12 inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes. Be careful not to over-

bake. Cool. Cut into 16 squares.

 2 1/2 tsp. baking powder
 1/2 tsp. salt
 1/2 c. shortening
 1/2 c. milk
 1 egg

Pour into greased 9"x13" square pan. Bake 35-35 minutes in 350 degree oven.

dough can be refrigerated up to three days - that can be a real help at times. This is from Betty Crocker's Favorite Recipes:

Overnight Cinnamon Rolls
 (Makes 2 dozen rolls)
 1 pk. active dry yeast
 1/2 cup warm water (105 - 115 degrees)
 4 c. all-purpose flour
 1 c. sugar
 1 tsp. salt
 1 c. butter or margarine, softened
 3 eggs, beaten
 1/2 c. lukewarm milk (scalded then cooled)
 2 Tbsp. butter or margarine, melted
 1/2 c. sugar
 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
 Cinnamon glaze

Dissolve yeast in warm water. Mix flour, 1/2 c. sugar and the salt in a large bowl. Cut in 1 cup butter with pastry blender until the mixture looks like meal. Stir in yeast, milk and eggs. Mix until the dough is smooth. Cover and refrigerate at least 8 hours or until ready to use. (The dough can be refrigerated at 45 degrees or below up to 3 days. Keep covered.)

Grease 24 muffin cups. Turn half the dough onto a well-floured board and roll into a rectangle, 12x10 inches. Brush with 1 Tbsp. melted butter. Mix 1/2 c. sugar and the cinnamon and spread half over the rectangle. Roll up beginning at the wide side. Pinch the edge of the dough into the seal well; stretch the roll to make even. Cut into 1-inch slices and place in the muffin cups. Repeat with the remaining dough. Cover and let rise until double, 1 to 1 1/2 hours.

Heat oven to 375 degrees. Bake 15 to 20 minutes or until golden. While warm, frost rolls with:

Creamy Glaze
 Mix 1 1/2 cups confectioners' sugar, 2 Tbsp. soft butter or margarine, 1/2 c. vanilla and 1 or 2 Tbsp. hot water until smooth and of spreading consistency.

Note: You can mix the dough with an electric mixer. Dissolve yeast in warm water in large mixer bowl. Add 1/2 c. sugar, milk, egg yolks, salt, 1/2 c. butter and 2 c. flour. Blend 1/2 minute on low speed, scraping the bowl constantly. Beat 1/2 minute on medium speed, scraping occasionally. With spoon, stir in remaining flour until the dough is smooth.

One of my own favorite recipes, this one-bowl quick cake can be used in many ways. Try your favorite frosting, a broiled topping, a canned or instant pudding, or fruit and whipped topping. It is very good for strawberry shortcake if you are tired of, or don't care for, those "sponge things" they display

until they are completely cool, then drain them thoroughly, cut them in half (if desired) and finish in your usual way for potato salad.

Hope there is something here that will turn your "kitchen duty" into "kitchen fun" and become one of those recipes you always reach for.





Kim wasn't as fortunate in her other event at the state, the 300-meter low hurdles. She finished with a 46.8 in the prelims, not enough to advance her to Saturday's finals.

Teammate Kelly Vaughn participated in the shot put Saturday morning. The junior-to-be tossed the metal ball 33 feet, 10 inches in placing tenth overall.

Rich Bracken, who will be a senior this fall, was the first representative in four years to the 79th boys event. Despite starting the race with a case of the jitters, Rich was 11th in the 1600-meter run with a time of 4 minutes, 32.1 seconds.



(As Amended)

AN ORDINANCE TO INCREASE THE COMPENSATION OF THE CLERK-TREASURER OF THE VILLAGE OF SUNBURY, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF SUNBURY, DELAWARE COUNTY, OHIO, THAT:

SECTION 1. The salary of the Clerk-Treasurer of the Village of Sunbury substantially increased during the period January 1, 1986 through May 1986 because of the Village waste water treatment project and the lack of a municipal income tax officer.

SECTION 2. The Clerk-Treasurer shall be compensated for the additional duties referred to in Section 1 at the rate of \$500.00 per month for January 1986 through May 1986 inclusive in addition to the compensation already received.

SECTION 3. The Clerk-Treasurer shall assume the additional duties of coordinating the Village waste water treatment project for the duration of such project.

SECTION 4. The salary of the Clerk-Treasurer shall be \$12,000.00 per year.




